We hope to bring AVANCE to the Wesley Center in the future.

WESLEY CENTER OPENING

Last month, we celebrated the highly anticipated opening of the new Wesley Center with an open house. Members of the business community, local officials, donors and family and friends of United Community Centers attended and toured the new facility, met teachers and staff and enjoyed a fiestastyle evening, which featured mariachis, food, and a dedication.

The rich history of United Community Centers began with the Wesley House located on North Commerce in 1909. A new Wesley Center was constructed in 1967 at 3600 N. Crump in order to further accommodate the needs of the growing community and today the history continues for Wesley as it moves into its next chapter of growth. This facility will mark the third building for the Wesley Center since it opened its doors.

The City of Fort Worth partnered with United Community Centers to allocate \$766,000 towards the direct completion of the construction of the new facility. Efforts to rebuild the center began in October 2014 and were completed in early June.

It was a wonderful opportunity to work with both Linbeck Construction Company and Bennett Benner Partners Architects for the completion of the Wesley Centers. UCC is ecstatic to be able to be in a building that will allow the Wesley Center to serve more clients and host more children and youth in our Educational Enrichment and ACTIII programs.



The last center to be rebuilt in our capital campaign is the Bethlehem Center. UCC is very excited and hopes that the construction of the center will be completed in late fall of 2015. Be on the lookout for our open house announcement once the center is complete!

SUMMER EDUCATIONAL ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

What a wonderful and busy summer it has been! The Wesley Center celebrated the beginning of their summer program by moving into their newly constructed center. It's been 10 weeks packed with learning, activities, and excitement. We are very proud to say that every child enrolled in our Summer Leveled Literacy Intervention program at the Bethlehem Center has gone up at least one reading level through the course of this summer. Over the course of the summer, UCC served over 41,000 meals to the children and youth at the Bethlehem, Polytechnic and Wesley Centers.

All three centers had a summer filled with fun, including visits to the library, Amon G. Carter

museum, Rangers games, a swim party at Mira Vista catered by Mama's Pizza, the movies, the Fort Worth Zoo, local community parks, waterparks, the botanical gardens, Log Cabin Village, the Fort Worth Museum of Science and History, the Sid Richardson Museum, and the Perot Museum.

Special visitors came to each center this summer: TWU came out to tutor students at the Poly Center, Joshua UMC brought a vacation bible school to the Bethlehem Center, and the annual North District of the Central Texas Conference Christmas in July was held at the Wesley Center.
